## SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

Happy New Year!

I can't believe that 2017 is already upon us. Perhaps it was the extended autumn we had, or the busyness of the past many months, but it seems like 2016 flew by so quickly.

And then, some days it seemed to have dragged on, and time couldn't pass quickly enough.

With the spark of the New Year comes the time-honored tradition to make a resolution – to lose weight, to travel, to read more books, to somehow recommit oneself to being better, in whatever capacity that means.

I haven't given a whole lot of thought to what my resolution will be. To be very honest, the recent news about the withdrawal of the Franciscans from our community has hit me like a ton of bricks; many of my days have been a struggle as we wait for the dust to settle and as we ponder what the next year will bring. I feel guilty for being in this place of uncertainty, of anxiety, of impatience. I feel like, especially because I am on staff, I should somehow be able to pull myself up by my bootstrings and move on. However, I find myself in the all-too-familiar stages of grief.

While we should not fixate on our current circumstances or dig our heels in in a bout of stubbornness, it is healthy to go through these various stages. I realize this may not impact everyone in the same way, so, at this time, I am primarily speaking to those who are also struggling or who find themselves overcome with sadness.

Knowing that January 1<sup>st</sup> brought a new meaning this year, I found this column a bit daunting to write. This is Day One of something new – accompanied by a bag of mixed emotions. Grasping for how to start this year and this column out from under Fr. Anthony's wing, I went to Scripture. I found these very comforting words in the first reading, when the Lord is speaking to Moses:

"The LORD bless you and keep you! The LORD let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you!

The LORD look upon you kindly and give you peace!"

We've heard these words many times, offered by Fr. Anthony as the final blessing at the end of Mass. Upon reading them, tears instantly filled my eyes.

I quickly realized that this year cannot be one simply of grieving Fr. Anthony or of residing in the unknown. We have a mission — given by Jesus himself — to share the Good News with all who stumble in the darkness. We should all be open to what God has in store for us. Let me be clear, however: it is healthy to go through any grieving stages needed and it is important to reach out, ask questions, and get help if needed; but we cannot become complacent or stagnant. We must cast our anxiety, our fears, our grief on the Lord, for he will sustain us in times of greatest difficulty. Likewise, if you are one who is not nearly as impacted or find yourself eager to have people "move on," please be patient and compassionate. This is a big transition. However, it does not mean that we as a people, as a community of faith, are changing. We will continue to be the bright light on the north side — sharing the Gospel with those who still need to hear it.

Father Anthony and the Franciscans have shared much of their knowledge and care and Franciscan nature with all of us. As he lay dying, St. Francis is known to have said, "I have done what was mine to do; may Christ teach you what you are to do." Let that be a resolution all of us can strive to maintain.
